**Lejonvarn v Burgess: Revisited.**

A talk in which David Sears QC (who acted for the successful Respondents) revisits the implications of the decision of the Court of Appeal in *Lejonvarn v Mr & Mrs Burgess* [2017] EWCA 254 concerning a professional consultant who was found to have owed a duty of care in tort for gratuitous services performed for friends.
